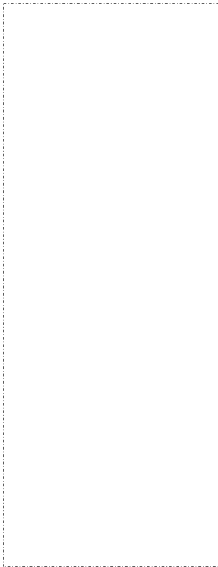
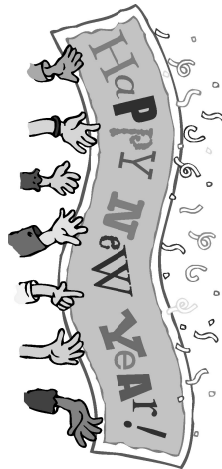

Christmas and the holiday season have become a recent memory. The gifts have all been unwrapped and the goodies have all been eaten. The decorations appear forlorn without the childlike anticipation of Christmas morning. It is time to return to our daily activities.

How are we to carry our recent excitement and joy with us into the mundane repetitions of our daily existence? Is it possible to maintain joy when washing dishes, taking out the trash, doing laundry, or mopping the kitchen floor? Jesus, the Christ, was born into this world as a human child and probably grew up performing His share of daily chores. It is kind of hard to imagine Jesus cleaning up the kitchen or taking out the trash, but one fact remains, He bridged the chasm between the ultimate, unknowable Divine, and fallen, sinful humanity. The message: God cares about our mundane, daily activities, and the existence to which we must return.

Kathleen Norris, in *Finding Faith in the Mundane*, tells us, “We must look for blessings to come from unlikely, everyday places—out of Galilee, as it were—and not in spectacular events, such as the coming of comet (star).” Norris continues

by reminding us how much fun children have while playing in a sink full of water and encourages us to remember—remember how to play. “Children delight in filling, emptying and refilling plastic bowls, cups, and glasses, watching bubbles form as they pressed objects deeper into the sink or tried to get others to stay afloat.” How many times will a child repeat this activity and not become bored? Children have an amazing capacity for repetition. Have you ever had a five-year-old ask you “Why?” They don’t give up easily.

Sadly, adults get bored and give up very quickly and easily. God commanded that we pray without ceasing, and that we worship and sing praise on a regular basis. When Adam was forced out of the Garden of Eden he was given repetitive work to do. In Genesis 3:17b-19a, we are told, *The very ground is cursed because of you; getting food from the ground will be as painful as having babies is for your*

wife; you'll be (The Fellowship) working in pain all your life long. The ground will sprout thorns and weeds, you'll get your food the hard way; planting and tilling and harvesting, sweating in the fields from dawn to dusk. (TM)

Sweating from dawn to dusk sounds pretty awful and monotonous but that is what God commanded us to do. Nineteenth century philosopher and theologian, Soren Kierkegaard, reminds us, “Repetition is reality, and it is the seriousness of life . . . repetition is the daily bread which satisfies with benediction (blessing).” Norris adds, “Repetition is both as ordinary and necessary as bread, and the very stuff of ecstasy.”

The very repetition of life is the work God gave us to do. As you return to the mundane tasks of life, after having spent joyous, celebratory time with the Christ child, look for playful ways to combine worship, prayer, and the repetition of daily living.
